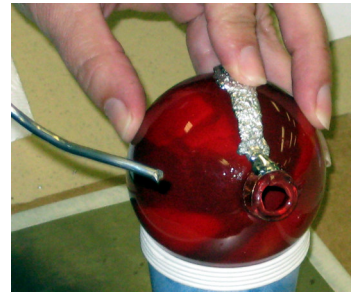
All submissions will be acknowledged and those we cannot publish will be returned.

OUR JANUARY MEETING

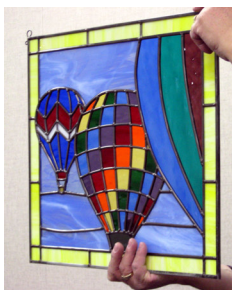
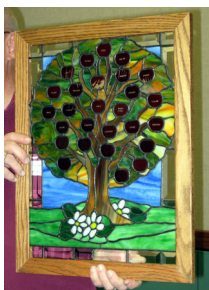
Our January program was a hands on demonstration on the making of Christmas ornaments and was presented by Lea Wimmer. Lea demonstrated how to use acrylic paints to get a marbling effect in a clear glass Christmas bulb. She then used solder on galvanized metal to create decorative elements which were attached with copper foil. These ornaments can then be enhanced with ribbon or a variety of decorative embellishments.
