Our August program will be about the dramatic effects of light logic and will be presented by Nathan Opp. Light logic creates the illusion of depth and space to art works including stained glass pieces. Nathan will show examples of his paintings while explaining the way he uses light and shadow. He will relate light logic to stained glass designs and production.

Nathan is the Professor of Art History and Painting at Oral Roberts University and has won numerous local and national awards for his work. He did his Undergraduate work at Biloa University of California and his Masters work at Pratt Institute of New York City. Nathan also has earned a Master of Art Degree from Tulsa University. He is married to Guild member Heather Opp.

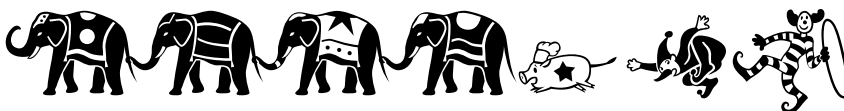

Dan Anderson brought arrowheads he found near Grand Lake (left).

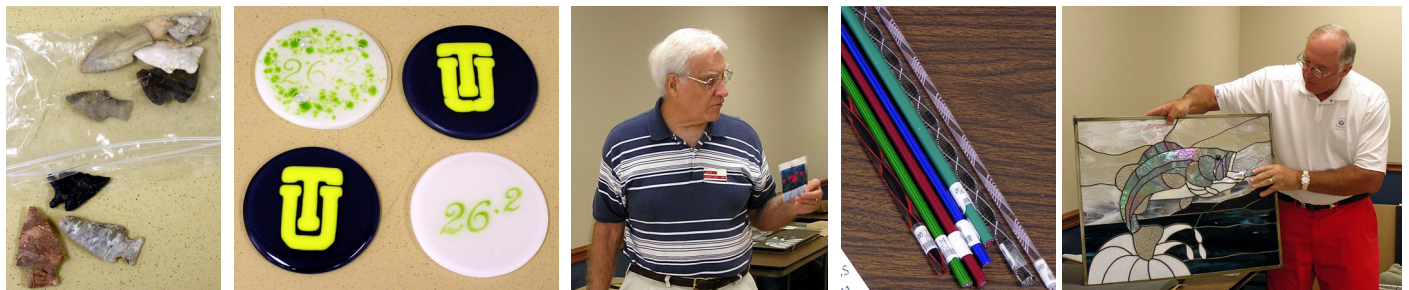
Jim Perkin brought fused TU and 26.2 marathon coasters (left of center).
